The Future Tense

The Future Tense is used to show that an action will take place in the future. The modal verb 'will' is added to the infinitive.





<u>Tomorrow</u> Tony _____sweets to share with his classmates. (bring)

<u>Tomorrow</u> Tony <u>will bring</u> sweets to share with his classmates. (bring)

Infinitive = bring

Future Tense = will + bring = will bring
