

Future Perfect Tense

will have + past participle

e.g. When you get this message, I **will have left** for Melbourne.

When do we use Future Continuous Tense?

Completion before a specified time in the Future

e.g. By the end of this week, she **will have completed** her assignment.

Duration in the Future

e.g. He **will have worked** in Japan for exactly thirty years by 2020.

Certainty about the Near Past

e.g. They **will have arrived** at the hotel by now.
