

- The Dutch were the first to settle in Mauritius. They
 were followed by the French and the British.
- Nowadays Mauritius is proud to be a multicultural country where people of different origins live peacefully.
- Our ancestors came to settle on the island for different reasons. They came from different parts of the world namely:
- (i) Europe (mainly from France)
- (ii) Africa (e.g. slaves were brought from Mozambique and Madagascar)
- (iii) India (e.g. slaves and indentured labourers)
- (iv) China (e.g. Chinese immigrants)
